Advent Wreath Lighting

(Romans 8:22-25, 12:12, John 16:33) led by the Tanouye family

Reader 1: Today is a day of hope. For generations, Christians have used four candles to represent four great themes that rise from our faith in Jesus: hope, peace, joy, and love. We start with hope, because hope is always alive.

Reader 2: During Advent, we use evergreens to decorate our homes and churches because evergreens remind us to keep hope always alive in our hearts.

Reader 1: The Apostle Paul reminded the church in Rome why Christians have hope: "We know that all God created has been groaning. It is in pain as if it were giving birth to a child. The created world continues to groan even now...

Reader 2: We also groan inside ourselves as we look forward to the time when God will adopt us as full members of his family. Then he will give us everything he has for us. He will raise our bodies and give glory to them. That's the hope we had when we were saved.

Reader 1: But hope that can be seen is no hope at all. Who hopes for what he already has? We hope for what we don't have yet. So we are patient as we wait for it. ...

Reader 2: Rejoice in hope, be patient in times of trial, be faithful in prayer."

Reader 2: We light our first candle [the first purple candle is lit] to remind us to be hopeful. Our world can be a dark and scary place and it's easy to be disheartened, but we are hopeful because Jesus "has overcome the world."

Prayer: Holy God, giver of hope, as we begin our Advent pilgrimage, grant us the courage to hope – hope for your presence, hope for your peace, hope for your promise. Amen.
