




We also learned the greatest gifts, abilities, talents held by members and friends of Church of the Holy Cross. You said these are the things you are best at:

Announcement:

For 3 weeks in September, I was invited to visit Peruvian villages supported by the Cijnaya Foundation based near Lake Titicaca. Visitations of numerous groups included warm welcomes by a dozen separate groups who benefit from gifts and mini loans made by several American university and church groups - the largest of which helped with the purchase of a \$50,000 John Deere tractor which is shared by several of the diverse groups in the 14,000 ft elevation of the Peruvian Altiplano region. These Peruvians are very happy to share what little they have, and we were gifted with numerous meals consisting of the dozen or so varieties of potatoes and cheese produced on these farms, and followed by group dancing. Although quite lacking in personal comforts such as running water and toilet facilities, the Peruvians are joyous and loving, and our group met with open hearts and hands at every encounter. The 15 of us traveled the largely unpaved roads in a van and encountered conversations in Quechua and Aymara as well as Spanish, which I was fortunate to be able to blunder through so that I could communicate on our visits.

I was so touched by the challenging lives these Peruvians live, and again so thankful for the comforts we Americans enjoy. Peru is largely Christian, and church attendance is very high in spite of the challenges they have getting to church regularly. We experienced several weddings several weddings—one in a double Pisac cathedral, where we were all covered with confetti in great joy—and I learned that Saturday is wedding day in Peru. The regional costumes are beautiful and colorful in spite of the poverty of everyday life.

It was inspiring to me to be immersed in this culture—much as it has been on previous tours to France, Japan, Thailand and India—which is so very different from my own, and have the opportunity have heartful meetings with new friends. The opportunity to visit Machu Picchu, as well as the Inca ruins of Ollyatantambo and Pisac, was the fulfillment of a long held dream of mine, which I will long remember. I am grateful for this

opportunity to experience such a very different part of the world.


